The question was raised as to why the Department of Education was not funding the new basketball courts. The school budget is a lump sum and they have to spend 94%, staffing equates to 91% so would have to save up over many years. Given the basketball courts aren't broken they won't pay for them. The department can be contacted to see in what timeline they would consider replacing them however it's likely to be many many years.

Given Bendigo Bank would view the work as capital works and the scope of the grant perhaps it is not the best grant to apply for in regards to this specific grant/specific courts.

Shire of Mundaring grant may be better suited however it is only up to \$2000 however it is certainly a helpful contribution. It is good for the community seeing as the courts are open to the public and used by the netball teams when they're up to scratch.
